

## CHECKLIST - On the Road

	Car Buying Checklist Items	Check	Comments	
1.	Is the <b>steering wheel</b> comfortable? Adjustable - scope version or up and down?			
2.	Evaluate <b>steering and handling</b> at low speeds and high speeds.			
3.	Do you feel like <b>the road</b> is inside the car with you? Does the car have a stiff feel to it, or do you have considerable <b>movement</b> when steering?	35		
4.	If manual transmission, do the clutch and gas have an even, smooth flow to them? Are you jerking from a stopped position because the gears aren't meshing or simply because you are inexperienced in the method of smoothly accelerating a stick shift vehicle?			
5.	Is it ABS equipped (Anti-Lock Braking System?)			
6.	Is the acceleration from a complete stop powerful or lackluster?		e e

7.	Does the car actually go <b>0-60 miles per hour</b> in 10 seconds? Is it enough power for what you need the car for?			
8.	Check the <b>suspension</b> by taking on a few speed bumps in parking lots.			
9.	Heater and A/C - Try both no matter the season. Extreme cold climates and equally extreme hot climates need to be cooled and warmed up quickly. Estimate the time it takes.			
10.	Check windshield wipers and washer fluid spray. Your new car should come filled with fluids. If you are testing an SUV or Crossover or VAN there may be wipers in the rear as well.		,	
11.	Check the <b>emergency brake</b> on an incline if possible. If you are on flat ground you need to see how easy or difficult it might be to release the brake and/or press down to lock it.			
12.	Is there a sunglass holder or small mirror above the rearview mirror? I call them backseat monitors. If you have small children you can watch who hit who by looking in the mirror: if you have teens you can see any faces they make when you tell them to shut off their electronics.
